Robert "Bob" E. Berger

13 Times National Finals Rodeo Qualifier

Over 20 Years in Rodeo



Bobby Berger was born on June 22, 1945 in Halstead, Ks to Marlin and Loreva Berger. One of six siblings, Bob won his first Little Britches Rodeo in 1962 in all three rough stock events. That was the beginning of a rodeo career that spanned over 20 years.

While attending college on a rodeo scholarship, Bob earned his Professional Rodeo Cowboy Association (PRCA) permit.

During his career, Bob competed in three rough stock events and

qualified for the National Finals Rodeo 13 times. He won the NFR bullriding average in 1971 and the NFR saddle bronc average in 1980. Bob was the PRCA season champion in saddle riding in 1977 and won the Saddle Bronc World Championship in 1979. Bob, a former PRCA board of directors member, was the first cowboy to ride the famous bronc Descent from Beutler Brothers Rodeo Company .

Currently, Bob Berger is in the oil and gas industry and ranches in Pearsall, Tx.
