



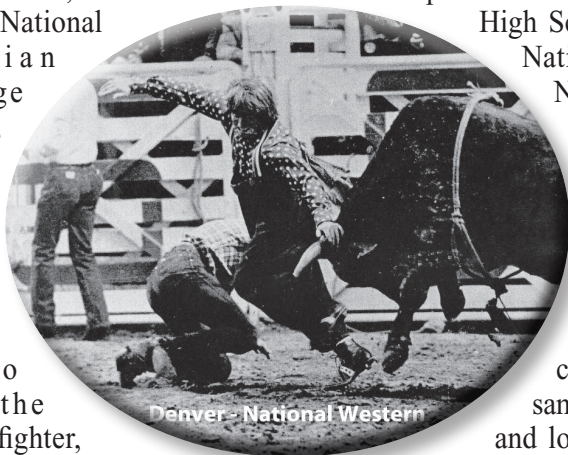

Larry Clayman

Larry clowned for Jim Shoulders, as well as for other stock contractors up and down the East Coast: Foy and Reynolds, among others, in Virginia, Florida, Pennsylvania, Alabama, Delaware, all over. He worked for stock contractors across the country: Cotton Rosser, Harry Vold, the Alsbaughs, Keslers, Suttons, and Korkows. After his discharge from the Marines in 1965, he went back to California where Cotton Rosser's Flying U Rodeo Co. and Andy Jauregui's J Spear combined to make the Golden State Rodeo Co. It was one of the biggest in the business and he clowned and fought bulls for them.

Throughout his career, which spanned three decades, he worked some of the biggest rodeos in North America: the Calgary Stampede, the National Western in Denver, Madison Square Gardens, the Cow Palace, the National High School Finals, the Indian National Finals, the College National Finals, and the National Finals in 1973, the Olson and Lucia with Jerry Tommy.
