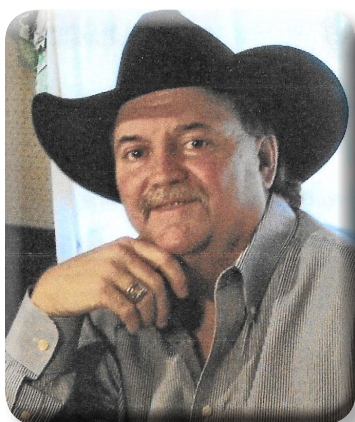




William Howard Halbert

Howard has participated in many Art and Museum Shows across the country including Cheyenne Frontier Days in Cheyenne, Wyoming where his piece titled "Little Red Man" won the Museum Purchase Award in 2019 and The Small Works Great Wonders at the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum in Oklahoma City, Okla. where his piece titled "Full Attention" won the prestigious Volunteer's Choice Award in 2016, his first year in the show.

Howard currently resides near Cleburne, Texas where he is an active supporter of the Johnson County Children's Advocacy Center, which hosts the annual "Cowboys for Kids" benefit. His work can be found in numerous private collections and his originals are represented by Charles Morin Fine Art, Fredericksburg, Texas and San Antonio, Texas.
