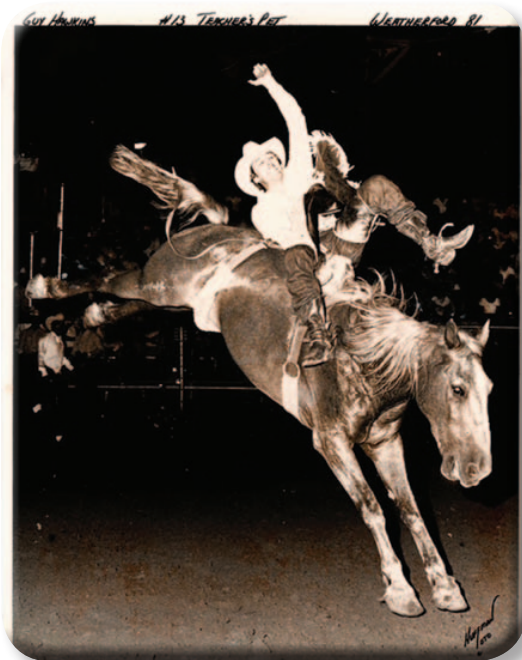


ALL COWBOY & ARENA CHAMPIONS HALL OF FAME

Guy Hawkins

Bareback Rider



Guy Hawkins of Fort Worth mounted his first bareback horse his freshman year in high school. He remained local honing his skills entering bareback ridings at Roland Reed's jackpots and at the Kowbell arena in Mansfield. He entered his first rodeo his senior year, 1971, and placed at many high school rodeos winning the championships at Corsicana and Cleburne.

Also, in '71 Guy married and moved to Bowie, Texas and primarily rodeoed on

the weekends. He place or won several open rodeos including the bareback riding at Longview, Texarkana, Henrieta, Stamford's Cowboy Reunion, New Braunfels and Pasadena. In '77 and '78 he qualified in the top 15 in the ETRA and CRA. He was the Reserve Champion Bareback Riding in '79.

Hawkins got his PRCA card in '81 and went to as many rodeos as he could while he and his father, Pete Hawkins, started a new business venture, Pro Cuts. He won or placed in serveral PRCA



rodeos, including Mesquite, Poteau, OK, Madisonville, Crossett, Ark., Texarkana, Liberty, Texas, Hawarden, Iowa, Lubbock, Texas, Springfield, Missouri, Austin, Abilene, Cincinnati, Ohio and Nacogdoches. In '82, Guy qualified for the PRCA Circuit Finals.

At this point Guy turned all his energies and focus on his business, Pro Cuts.

He started Team Roping with his fellow bareback rider and good friend David Don. In 1991,, the pair won the USTRC Finals in Guthrie, Oklahoma.

Guy has always given back to the sport of rodeo which he loves. He served on the Windy Ryon Memorial Roping Board for 10 years as a board member of the North Texas High School Rodeo Association. His company, Pro Cuts, was Title Sponsor for the NTHSRA for eight years. He also served on the Fort Worth Calf Scramble and Greeting Committee 6 years.

Guy, a Gold Card Holder in the PRCA, and his wife Susan, reside in Garner, Texas. Both are extremely active in their local church. His son, "Pistol Pete" Hawkins followed in his father's footsteps as a bareback rider and made 6 trips to the NFR.

Won several open rodeos including Stamford's Cowboy Reunion - 1977 & 78 qualified top 15 in the ETRA and CRA - Reserve Champion Bareback rider 1979 - won or placed in several PRCA rodeos, 1982 qualified for the PRCA Circuit finals -1991 won the USTRC Finals team roping in Guthrie, OK - Served on Windy Ryon Memorial Roping board for 10 years.
