Tanya Denise Tucker

Country Music Star



Tanya Tucker was born October 10, 1958 in Seminole, Texas and was the youngest of three children of her mother and father Alma Juanita and Jesse Melvin “Beau” Tucker. Tanya grew up in Wilcox, Arizona listening to country stars on the local, and only, radio station.

Tanya’s career began in 1972 with the release of the popular song “Delta Dawn”.

The end of the 1970s saw a decline in Tanya’s career but in 1986 she signed with Capitol Records and returned to the hit charts with the song “One Love at a Time”.

Tanya was nominated “Female Vocalist of the Year” by the Country Music Association (CMA) in 1988 and in 1991 was awarded that title by the CMA.

Tammy won her first Grammy Awards in 2020 for the songs “Bring My Flowers Now” and “While I’m Livin”.

Tanya established herself as a Country music Outlaw early in her career and that image grew as she matured.

Tucker continues to perform at benefits for the military.
