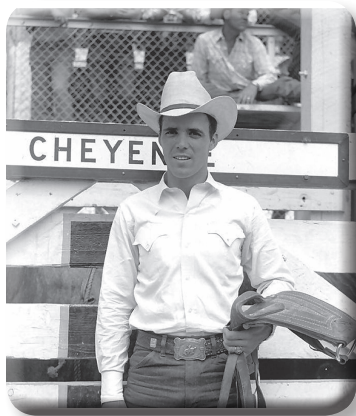




Garland Weeks
